The purpose of this program is to provide participants with an overview of pediatric nursing care.

Objectives

2. Describe the physiological differences in the infant's and child's organ systems as compared to the adult.
3. Identify the elements included in a complete pediatric history.
4. Identify the correct method for approaching the pediatric patient for a physical exam.
5. Discuss the importance of the first impression in assessing children and explain the role of the pediatric triangle in highlighting the interplay of appearance, breathing, and circulation in the child.
6. Describe major changes in physical growth that occur in the child and how these changes are monitored.
7. Discuss ways to promote health in the growing child including immunizations, safety, sleep and nutrition.
8. Identify selected common childhood health problems, such as anemia, lead poisoning, intestinal parasitic diseases, injuries, and communicable diseases and discuss related nursing care.
