

Benefits of Consortium for Clinical Education and Practice



SAVES TIME

- Facilitates coordination of students between educational institutions and clinical facilities to optimize availability of clinical placements.
- Helps students and faculty save time by streamlining the orientation and time tracking credentialing process.



INFORMATION ACCESS

- Develops strategies to optimize clinical capacity.
- Offers easier access to information for both students and schools.



STANDARDIZED PROCESSES

- Standardizes the process of credentialing students and clinical faculty with streamlined timing and forms, so schools can operate more efficiently.
- Utilizes core orientation training and standardized credentialing requirements.



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
