Description

The educational activity will provide an overview on the state of family navigation and peer navigation supports in NC and first-hand accounts of what it means to families. The new, FREE online NC Family Navigation Guide (ncfamilynavigation.org) will be showcased with practical strategies for its use. The guide was developed by the North Carolina Navigating Care Project, with the support of HRSA grant #H6MMC33235. The North Carolina Family Navigation Guide supports health care professionals in working with families to find appropriate resources and services for the child and family.

Cultural considerations for working with families who represent diverse cultures will be a theme across all presentations, which will culminate with a panel of representatives across a range of cultural groups sharing their perspectives on common cultural barriers and suggestions for working with diverse families.
