The purpose of this conference is to provide practical and evidence-based approaches, tools, and techniques to improve the practice of healthcare professionals supporting breastfeeding* families.

DAY I will focus on comprehensive assessment as the foundation for successful interventions and outcomes. In addition, motivational interviewing will be introduced as an evidence-based approach for establishing realistic and patient-centered goals.

DAY II will shift to complex and often requested topics impacting breastfeeding success such as ankyloglossia, milk over-supply, pump types and indications, birth trauma, grieving infant loss and unrealized breastfeeding expectations. A highlight of the afternoon will be a panel sharing their unique experiences, insights into their "breastfeeding journeys" and valuable take-aways intended to improve lactation support practice.

- Articulate various treatment options for newborns presenting with ankyloglossia.
- Explain practical guidance for diagnosing and managing the different types of hyperlactation provided by the Academy of BreastFeeding Medicine's Protocol #32.
- Compare types of breast pumps and how their differences can guide pump choices for breastfeeding families.
- Recognize the impact of loss, grief and trauma on the care and support offered to families with unrealized expectations around childbirth and breastfeeding.
- Describe specific approaches and interventions to support and comfort families experiencing unexpected outcomes in their childbirth experiences.

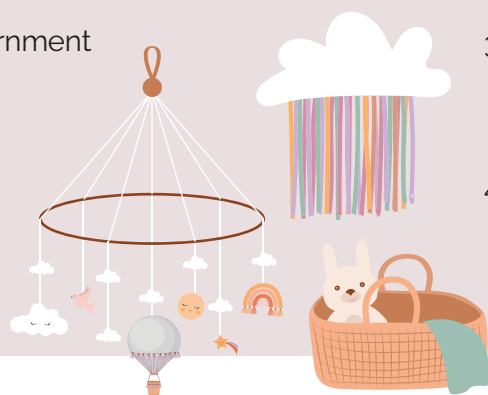
