Description

Survival strategies for mediating classroom conflict in academic settings are needed due to the current and prevalent issue of academic violence and bullying of faculty. Nurse educators need to understand the dynamics of academic violence and bullying directed toward them. They need practical strategies for handling such conflict in to minimize the negative impact on themselves and their families that can rise to different levels of emotional, behavioral disorders (e.g., depression, anxiety, PTSD).

This workshop provides a framework as well as realistic hope and practical approaches (e.g., survival handbooks for victims and bystanders). Throughout the workshop, case studies, role-play, and appendices will assist the participant in applying the model with a focus on Motivational Interviewing (MI) techniques.

Outcome

Participants will self-assess that they gained knowledge about the theoretical framework for academic violence and bullying to occur and how to apply framework to their practice.
