Dr. Politte is a board-certified child/adolescent and adult psychiatrist, currently serving as medical director of outpatient services in the WakeMed Mental Health and Well-Being service line. She attended medical school at UNC-Chapel Hill and completed my residency and fellowship training at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston, MA. Before joining WakeMed in July 2019, she worked at UNC's Carolina Institute for Developmental Disabilities, both as a clinician and clinical researcher. Her primary clinical practice is in the WakeMed outpatient child psychiatry clinic and with the Collaborative Care team. Her special interest is in treating children and adults with neurodevelopmental disorders, including ADHD, autism spectrum disorder, intellectual disability, and genetic syndromes.
