Program Description

This conference is designed to address the most current clinical challenges facing healthcare teams that care for patients with acute and chronic wounds. The goal of this conference is to advance wound care knowledge, competence and skills through an interdisciplinary team approach. Participants will gain insight into preventing, assessing and treating patients with different types of wounds, including difficult to heal wounds.

Target Audience

Physicians in Family and Internal Medicine, Geriatrics, Advanced Practice Providers, Nurses, Case Managers, Nursing Home Professionals and other healthcare clinicians involved in the management of wound care

Learning Objectives

At the conclusion of this competency-based activity, the participant should be able to:

- Describe the initial assessment of a wound and systemic approach to traumatic wounds.
- Differentiate between simple and complicated wounds.
- Distinguish between acute and chronic wounds, and identify common types like pressure injuries, venous ulcers, and diabetic foot ulcers.
- Learn to conduct a complete wound assessment, including patient history, physical examination, and how body systems impact healing.
- Recognize and analyze how intrinsic (age, chronic disease) and extrinsic (nutrition, smoking, medications) factors can inhibit or promote healing.
- Describe how to perform accurate nutritional and diabetic assessments and interpret laboratory values to identify deficiencies in patients with wounds.



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Learning Objectives *continued*

- Apply current, evidence-based guidelines and protocols for nutrition care in wound management.
- Describe the purposes of splinting and compression.
- Explain the physiologic principles and historical evolution of hyperbaric oxygen therapy (HBOT).
- Describe how oxygen under pressure enhances wound healing and tissue repair.
- Describe the methods and techniques of wound closure that now exist in the reconstructive tool kit, including "spray-on" skin, skin substitutes, tissue rearrangement, local flaps, free tissue transfer.
