This program is designed to introduce the concepts and implementation of trauma and trauma-informed care as well as how trauma and public health disparities are related. Research and clinical evidence documents that trauma-informed approaches involve thinking about trauma in different ways, and altering service practices to create opportunities for survivors to rebuild a sense of control, empowerment, and balance in their lives. The audience will learn about these ideas and view *Resilience*, a documentary highlighting how communities can work together to address adverse experiences. Given that toxic stress and trauma have been linked to an increased likelihood of a variety of physical and mental illnesses, increasing understanding and utilization of trauma-informed practices can help to reduce health disparities and build resilience.

Main Conference

Human Trafficking continues to be a widespread crime in the United States as well as in North Carolina. While our ability to recognize signs of and understand factors leading to human trafficking have improved over the last several years, there is still much room for improvement with regards to interventions and collaboration among stakeholders. This conference seeks to explore the current state of Human Trafficking in North Carolina, increase provider cultural competency when working with people who have experienced human trafficking, and assist providers in identifying resources in the community that can be beneficial when working with survivors. Participants will be given the opportunity to learn from, with, and about each other's roles in working with human trafficking cases, ultimately improving communication, cohesiveness and collaboration.
