The NC AHEC Scholars Program recruits, trains, and supports a diverse group of students, creating a multidisciplinary team of health professionals committed to both community service and the transformation of health systems across the state.

With an emphasis on individuals from underrepresented minorities, disadvantaged/rural backgrounds, and first-generation college students, the NC AHEC Scholars Program aims to improve the diversity and distribution of all health professions.

AHEC Scholars at Wake AHEC will receive a \$1,000 per year subsidy, subject to academic or institutional approval. Each AHEC Scholar will receive an NC AHEC Scholars Certificate, setting them apart from other students in an increasingly competitive environment.

- Two-year program
- Runs September 1st–August 31st, 2023-2025
- 40 hours of didactic and 40 hours of clinical work each year
- Invaluable networking opportunities
